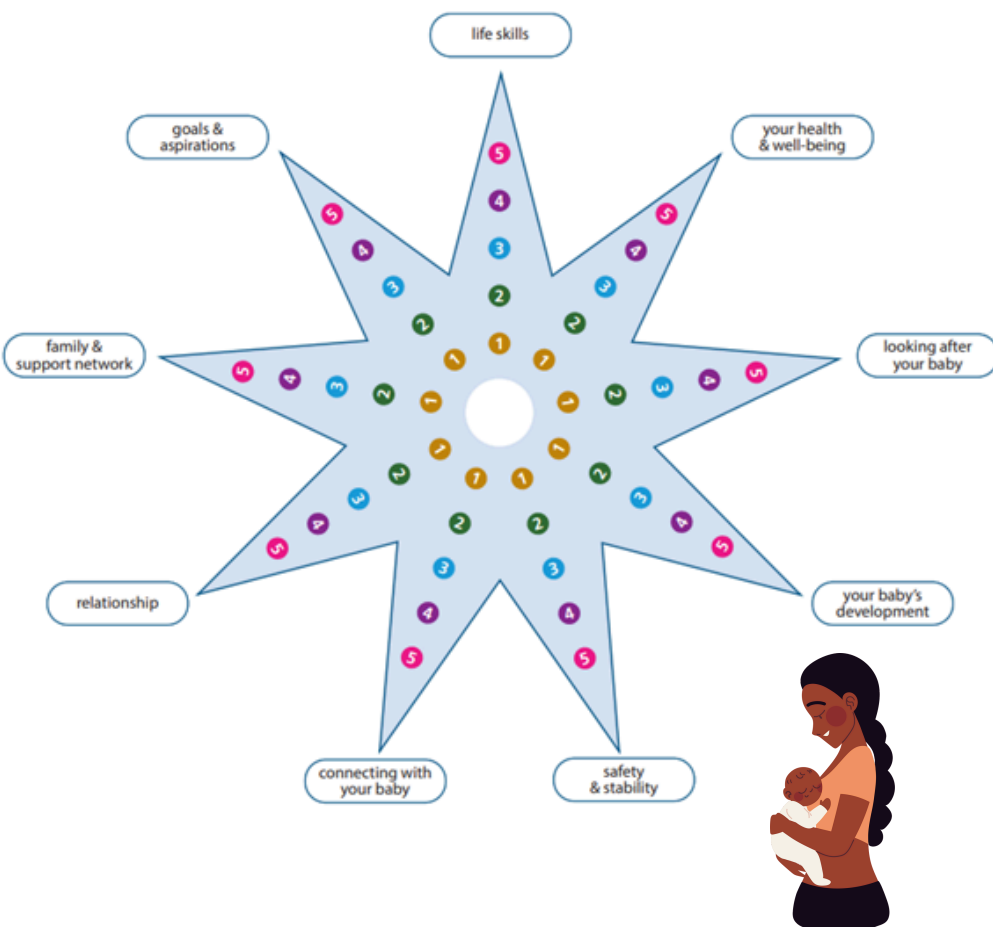


## THE NEW MUM STAR

## INTENSIVE SERVICE



### (PERSONALISED SERVICE)

The High Impact Health Visitors work with small caseloads of families offering additional contacts based on need; the team receive specialised supervision from the Parent Infant Psychotherapist and Integrative Child Psychotherapist to support them working with families who have complex needs.

To enable families to receive the right help, at the right time, for the right reasons; supporting to improve parents chances and keeping their children safe from harm, achieving good health outcomes and enabling them to thrive as they transition to school with the best chances of learning and achieving.

## INTENSIVE SERVICE AREAS

1. Transition to Parenthood from antenatal period to 12 weeks postnatally
2. Perinatal and Infant Mental Health
3. Healthy Weight and Health Nutrition
4. Families of Children with Special Educational Needs
5. Immunisation
6. Parents using Harmful Substances (Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, Vaping)
7. Integrated Reviews
8. Homelessness, Asylum and Refugee Families and Poverty
9. Domestic Abuse, Families in Women's Refuge, VAWG
10. Paediatric Liaison
11. Infant Feeding



# LEVELS OF THE ENHANCED HEALTH VISITING SERVICE

## Universal

Antenatal contact from 28 weeks.

New birth contact 10-14 days.

6-8 week post-natal contact for child/mother

8-12 month health and development review.

18 months desktop review

27 month/Integrated health and development review.



## Targeted

Additional support for an identified need, or may be receiving further support from one other service/agency.



1 month

3-4 months

3-3.5 years review



## Specialist

Families and children that require coordinated support from a number of different organisations such as SEND and includes those children under Early Help Support, LAC, CIN and CP Plans with the Local Authority

1 month

3-4 months

3-3.5 years review



**New - Intensive Service (Personalised Service)**

The Intensive Service is a targeted support service for pregnant people

(28 weeks +) and infants from 0 to 2 years with additional risk factors and health needs. (Level 5)

# TWO PATHWAYS FOR THE INTENSIVE SERVICE



## Ruby Pathway

Antenatal – 13 Months  
2 weekly for the first 3 months

Contacts with the High Impact Area health visitors and Senior Nursery Nurse

17 contacts

## Emerald Pathway

13 Months – 2.5 years  
2 weekly for the first 3 months  
Contacts with the High Impact Areas health visitors and Senior Nursery Nurse

15 contacts



## Senior Nursery Nurse Summary

Working alongside the Health Visitors to help support parents with healthy eating, weaning, sleep, potty training, behaviour/tantrums, home safety and practical support. Connecting families to the right support, such as the children and family hubs and local services.



## Referral criteria

The Intensive Service is aimed at pregnant people 28 weeks and infants from 0 to 2 years with additional risk factors and health needs.
